Who We Are, What We Are About

The Green Island Challenge is dedicated to the proactive protection of Guanaja's ecosystems.

Our mission is to provide alternative livelihoods for islanders by creating long-term, sustainable jobs, inspire youth action, and to nurture environmental consciousness in the community.

To date, we have successfully trained former poachers to protect parrot and turtle nests, and have launched an island-wide environmental education program.

Yellow-Naped Parrot Population Stabilization

36 nests were located and patrolled from January- June 2019.

Only 2 nests were poached.

After the hatching season, we were able to recuperate 4 recently captured parrots. They are now in rehabilitation-- two have already flown free.


Biggest threats: Illegal Trafficking and Deforestation. Critically endangered since 2018.

This year, 498 parrots were recorded. That is up from last year's 323 count.

We rely on former poachers and young adults with an interest in protecting their island.


Nidos de Lora Nuca Amarilla; *Amazona auropalliata* en la isla de Guanaja

and protect the wild
populations of the
yellow naped parrot
on Guanaja.

Specifically:

- Encourage the local population to protect yellow naped parrots.
- Establish an environmental education program to deter young folks from looting nests.
- Discourage their image as pets.
- Provide poachers with alternative livelihoods to halt all poaching.
- Conduct wellbeing surveys to address the needs of yellow-naped parrots in captivity.
- Rehabilitate recently captured parrots for freeing.
- Ensure that all future generations are “wild and free.”

Turtle Nest Defense Project

This project is on its second year and involves local captains, former poachers, student volunteers and Dr. Dunbar, a turtle researcher from the U.S.

Former turtle poachers, boat captains and student volunteers from every high school on Guanaja monitor the West and East End beaches by foot every night from June-October.

This year our success rate increased and we documented no poached nests vs 2 lost nests last year.

However, this year's total nest count was very low. We believe many turtles are being caught at sea, making day-time boat patrols a priority for next year.

We are actively in the process of declaring the West End beaches as a Ransa Site and as a Key Biodiversity Area. These are steps to ultimately obtaining UNESCO World Heritage Site status.



Environmental Education

All but two schools have been visited and taught the curriculum so far.

We have successfully formed small environmental volunteers in those schools.

We have organized beach clean-ups, recycled art projects and t-shirt campaigns.

Our goal is to build a “green-hub” library/community center in Mitch to further the reach of our education program.

Our plans for next year include more business outreach and beginning citizen science projects both for inland and marine species (bird watching clubs, coral bleach watch, rapid reef assessment).
